The judge the membership selected is Mr James (Jimmy) Moses and he told Barb he is honored to be asked to judge our National. The Board is discussing 2026 and 2027 hoping we can get dates and locations chosen so we can get the judges the membership desires before they are committed to other shows. AKC recently sent out the 2023 registration statistics. I'm going to share them with you. Our toy fox terrier numbers are down. If you look at the toy group, its down as well. My personal theory is it's because many of the toy breeders are aging. AKC registrations overall are up. We must continue to strive to get our breed better known and attract new people to the breed. Laura Johnson has some great ideas about introducing our breed to Juniors, more to come on that as we develop her idea to something we can push out to our specialties and members.

Speaking of juniors, in case you didn't know, Tabs Dvorak is our Junior Coordinator. If a junior is interested in doing things with their Toy Fox, it's a great opportunity to connect them with her.

If your dog has two or more titles in different events – conformation, rally, agility, Barnhunt, scent work, obedience, etc – you will be able to send in a form and copies of your titles and get a lovely certificate from the ATFTC recognizing you and your pup's achievements.
